


Punctuality:

I have been very impressed with the learning that has taken place in the past eight days!

We have kick started our 'Explore: Home' project by making sense of where we live. We have explored our local area using Google Earth and Google Maps, zooming in to find Europe, UK, England, London, Brighton, Lewes and Cooksbridge. Some children were able to use the 'Street View' function to 'walk' from school to their houses!

We have also been looking at different types of homes and after being inspired by the Three Little Pigs this week, we have been working in groups to build our own 3D homes using card, wood and toys.









FOXES CLASS

This term we are going to be learning all about 'Home' for our geography project, focusing in particular on our enquiry question -

"What is it like in Cooksbridge?"

The children have already begun to explore atlases and maps to learn about the world around them and have thought of some questions they would like to find out about the village of Cooksbridge.

We are very excited for the term ahead and look forward to learning new things.









BADGERS CLASS



We have been exploring our new project 'Explore: Home' and considering our new concepts - belonging, change and protest, discussing our big question 'What does it mean to belong?'. We are very excited to begin our project where we will be creating a community surrounded by the Downs made from papier mache.

We have begun one of our class readers in English, 'Belonging' by Jeannie Baker. It is a beautiful picture book which explores the 'rewilding' of an urban landscape and the changes that happen within a family alongside the growth of the vegetation. The children sequenced muddled images from the book and retold the story in their own words. They then chose a picture to describe. We have also set up an 'ice sculpture' experiment in Science. What a busy week! Please do pop in if you would like to see the project work we have completed so far.:)









OWLS CLASS



Owls have thoroughly enjoyed their start to the new project 'Explore: Home.' So far, through talk-partners and small group discussion, they have explored their understanding of the key concepts: diversity, community, identity and sustainability. In addition, through art and written work, they have reflected with insight and depth, their thoughts and feelings about home and belonging.

In geography this term, we are exploring our local area using a range of different maps, understanding where we live in the world in relation to the places around us. We will be developing our map reading skills, specifically interpreting and applying 6-figure grid references, symbols and contour lines. We look forward to discussing and preparing a debate focused on an important local issue, as well as comparing and contrasting our local area to a European town.

In science, we will be learning about climate change and the weather. Experiments will include measuring and recording the mean temperature and rainfall across a period of time at school. We are so proud of the children's diligence and engagement in lessons so far and we have so much to look forward to this term!
