Hamsey's Ofsted Report

As you know, our Ofsted report was published last week; we continue to be a good school. We are proud that 'the real sense of family' at the school was

recognised, and we value the child's comment that lessons are 'fun and exciting'. However, we are certainly not complacent; we know that there is still much to do to improve the school for all of our learners. Ofsted's comments re the next steps for Hamsey reflect what we are already working to address. Subject leadership is a focus on our current School Development Plan, Writing, too, is an area of development for us (as we have mentioned in our newsletters to you this year); we want our children's writing skills and their presentation of their ideas to improve. We know, too, that our attendance figures must be at least in line with the national average. Attendance is an area that we have to continue to improve.

Attendance matters at Hamsey; we want our children in school every day. As a school we are

working hard to improve the education of our children. Attendance is a major factor that affects the attainment and progress that our pupils make. Regular attendance supports their well-being, too. we need to improve our attendance. So, we are launching our Christmas Countdown Attendance Cracker! In the final 12 days leading up to the end of Term 2 we want 100% attendance. Children who are at school every day from Monday 3rd December until Tuesday 18th December will have their names put into a draw that will take place on the final day of Term 2, on Wednesday 19th December. They will have the chance to win £20 of Cineworld vouchers, something for the family to enjoy over the festive season.

Of course, we want our children attending every day. Our Christmas Countdown Attendance Cracker offers the chance for us to reward children who do attend every day. In Term3 we will be reviewing our attendance reward systems. We have got to improve our attendance; 94.2% is not good enough.

Car Parking around our School

Please park considerately and safely when you are dropping off your child in the morning or collecting them at the end of the school day. We asked, in our previous newsletter, that parents **do not** drive onto the school site at the beginning or end of the school day (from 8.30am-8.45am, and from 3.00pm-3.15pm). We want our parents and children to be able to access the site safely. Disappointingly, some parents are still driving onto the site during these times.

Adverse Weather

There was a light sprinkling of snow in parts of East Sussex yesterday; winter has arrived! If, due to exceptional weather conditions, we are unable to open the school we will notify you by text message. Any details regarding a school closure



will be on our school website and, also, on the East Sussex County Council website. Information regarding school closures is also given out on Heart FM.

We only close the school in exceptionally adverse weather conditions; we always try to remain open. However, the safety of our pupils and our staff is, of course, paramount.

Eligibility for Free School Meals

All children in Reception, Year I and Year 2 are currently entitled to free school meals.

Your child may be entitled to free school meals for <u>all</u> their time at Primary School.

If you are in receipt of Income Support, Income-based Jobseekers Allowance, Income related Employment and Support Allowance or some other form of support,, your child may be entitled to free school meals throughout primary school and possibly beyond.

If your child does qualify, they also receive Pupil Premium funding for at least 6 years. This funding is used to support children's learning and help towards the cost of, for example, school uniform, after school clubs and school trips. If you would like to apply for these 'long—term' free school meals you just need to complete a form that is available from the school office.

Remember, if you are in receipt of benefits, you need to register for free school meals, even if your child is in Reception, Year I or Year 2 to ensure they receive free meals beyond Year 2, and also for your child to receive the pupil premium funding.
