## Curriculum

We are particularly proud of our unique Skylark curriculum. We have devised a curriculum that is meaningful, purposeful and relevant to the children who live in this area of East Sussex, nestled at the foot of the South Downs.

The area is rich with local history and geography. We use these subjects as the drivers for our curriculum, allowing our children to truly immerse themselves in a project-based curriculum where subject-specific skills are explicitly taught in a planned, age appropriate and developmental way.

Through the Skylark curriculum, children are taught the importance of analysis as the key to understanding.

We aim to put our children at the centre of their own learning and place great emphasis on nurturing skills and attitudes such as resourcefulness, resilience and co-operation. Our teachers bring the National Curriculum alive by making links between the individual subjects and applying them to whole school projects.

Our children benefit from specialist tuition in sport on a weekly basis; each year group also gets weekly Forest School sessions for at least one term per year.

## Curriculum

The curriculum is divided into three stages:

1. Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS): Ages 4-5

2. Key Stage 1: Ages 5-7

3. Key Stage 2: Ages 7-11

#### **Early Years**

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum is based on the Government's Early Learning Goals with seven areas of learning:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

The children in Early Years are also taught Religious Education and have Forest School. In Early Years we use *Tapestry* software to communicate with parents.

#### **Trips**

The children are often taken on educational visits to complement their learning in school. Some of the places we have recently visited include Lewes Castle, the Mary Rose Museum, Butser Farm, Seven Sisters Country Park and Cuckmere Haven.

#### Residential

Each year our Year 6 children experience a residential trip to Bowles Activity Centre.

We have specialist STEM days and arrange trips to a local school to use their science laboratories.

We have two productions at Christmas; the Key Stage 1 nativity play and the Key Stage 2 carol concert. We also hold a Key Stage 2 production in the summer term.

The children enjoy celebrating national events like World Book Day, National Poetry Day and LGBT+ History Month.

## Forest School, Sport, Clubs and Pupil Voice

#### **Forest School**

We have a great Forest School and garden area. We have created a full programme with our Forest School staff. Every year group gets at least a sixweek block of sessions, with opportunities to learn new skills.





#### Sport

We believe that physical development is a key component to success across the whole curriculum and we have excellent PE provision. Our children take part in a range of sports within class PE lessons, as well as inter-federation events. Children also benefit from weekly specialist sports coaches.

## Special Education Needs and Disabilities

We believe that all children need to feel safe, happy and valued at school to learn, progress and develop their wellbeing.

We recognise the individuality of all children and the fact that they are at different levels of development physically, emotionally, intellectually and socially.

Staff recognise the need for differentiation in setting tasks for pupils. Teachers regularly hold pupil progress meetings with leadership and the SENCo to discuss any interventions required to support each child.

We are committed to working in partnership with parents and carers and in involving them and their children in decisions about learning and progress.

Arrangements are in place in school to support pupils with medical conditions.

Pupils with SEND are encouraged to participate fully in the life of the school and in any wider community activities.
