Punctuality


The school gate is opened at 8:30am and closed at 8:40am. Please ensure you are at school on time every day.

If you are late, you will need to take your child to the school office, where you will need to complete a **red form** to inform us of your arrival time and reason for being late. This will allow us to track punctuality across the term. Please do not leave children unattended before the gate is open, and make sure you come to the office if you are late. Arriving late not only disrupts your child's learning, but the whole school as well. Thank you for your support.

Withdrawal from Learning

I shared with families at the start of the year revised guidance around holidays in term time. As a reminder, unless it is exceptional circumstances I will not be authorising any withdrawals from learning. Penalty notices will be requested for any absences of 5 days or more:

- A first penalty notice of £160 per parent/carer per child, reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.
- If a second penalty notice is issued with 3 years, this is at a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days.
- On the third occasion within those 3 years when the threshold is met, alternative action will be taken. This could include prosecution of legal intervention.



FEDERATION SPORTING EVENTS

In Term 2 we have fewer events because of the run-up to Christmas, but next term we are going to trial families not spectating. This is because we want to fully focus on the children and to ensure our safeguarding is of the highest level. In Term 2 we have netball events for Y3/4 and Y5/6.

We hope you enjoyed the harvest performances this week. It was lovely to come together as a school community for the first time this academic year. I was very impressed by the children's signing, speaking and signing.

UNIFORM REMINDER
