We have enjoyed learning facts about Blackbeard, compared pirate ships to modern ships, made our own treasure maps and found out about all of the different jobs you could do on a pirate ship! Then to finish off our topic we were all mesmerised by our visiting pirates during the Pirate Workshop.

### **FOXES CLASS**



What an exciting start to the year Foxes Class have had! We have really been enjoying our new project all about ancient Egypt. Foxes have learned all about ancient Egyptian treasure, tombs, pharaohs and more. They have all worked hard painting beautiful cartouches and honed their artistic skills still further by drawing the famous mask of Tutankhamun. We have learned all about the Rosetta Stone and how this helped Egyptologists decipher hieroglyphs. The children even had a go at translating their names!

Our project about ancient Egypt will end with us learning about two famous pharaohs, Nefertiti and Cleopatra. This will then link nicely to our next project, *Treasure and Tiaras*, where we will learn about the lives of Queen Elizabeth I, Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth II.

### **BADGERS CLASS**



We have had a fabulous start to our 'Discover: Treasure' History project and have enjoyed finding out about the Anglo-Saxons and Scots. We particularly enjoyed our Anglo Saxon workshop and were thrilled when so many children in our class were picked to have key roles like a warrior, Lady of the village and archaeologists. Asher's amulet mold was even made into a pewter necklace! What an honour.

In science we have been learning about 'Living Things and their Habitats' and have created our own weird and wonderful creatures that we have added classification keys to. In English we have written our own poems inspired by Maya Angelou's poem 'And Still I Rise'. The children have blown us away with their empathic writing. We are really looking forward to our next history topic - The Vikings.



### **OWLS CLASS**



To enhance our Discover-Treasure project and our study of the Tudor Dynasty, we thoroughly enjoyed a late September trip to the The Mary Rose Museum in Portsmouth's Historic Dockyard. What an incredible day we had! From an immersive 4D theatre experience to a hands-on workshop exploring real artefacts recovered from King Henry VIII's favourite warship, the children returned even more enthusiastic to learn about this fascinating period in history! In particular, the trip fuelled an energetic and dynamic whole-class debate on 'Why did the Mary Rose sink?', with every pupil emotively participating and impressively articulating their theory using historical evidence to support. Year 6 also enjoyed an interactive and informative trip to Safety in Action at Newhaven Fort. Through mini 10-minute workshops with expert input, Q&A and quick-fire quizzes, the children engaged enthusiastically to learn about safety and crime prevention from a range of emergency service providers. We all learnt so much!

Owl students are budding scientists indeed! This term, the children have avidly enjoyed learning about the circulatory system, describing the functions of the heart, blood and blood vessels. As part of our work, they created a model of the human heart using playdoh, identifying key structures and showing oxygenated and deoxygenated blood. Looking at the photographs, can you identify the four chambers of the heart and the key vessels that carry blood to and from it? Have a go!













As part of their PSHE work on safety, Owls Class were visited by Matt Holt, our local neighbourhood youth officer, and his trainee colleague from Sussex Police. The children were given an informative presentation on internet safety and then had the opportunity to ask lots of questions about the police and the law. Thank you on behalf of Hamsey School for all the work you do in our community.

This, term Year 5 have been spending their Tuesday afternoons picking fruits and vegetables and preparing the school garden and allotment for winter.

The children picked so many beautiful apples that we just had to make some apple crumble! It was delicious - thank you to our Year 5 bakers and Mrs Whitehorn!
