FOREST SCHOOL

A message below from our fantastic forest school team:

The focus this term was the changing season and how we can support each other, and the animal and insect life around us. We developed team-building skills by working together to identify trees from their leaves in the forest school area and played games that required forward thinking and resilience.

When the weather was less kind, building dens together gave some welcome shelter! Year 4 practised their tool skills using bow saws, mallets and axes to prepare wood for a fire, as well as preparing and lighting the fire safely. A highlight this term was making nourishing and affordable soup using carrots, potatoes, celery and onions - every Year 4 child helped with peeling and chopping. If there is any assistance in the kitchen needed this Christmas we can officially confirm every child CAN help!

Reception learned all about Peekaboo the hedgehog, making leaf piles for him, hiding hedgehog food in secret places and checking he hadn't crawled too near a fire. Pine cone bird feeders were made to help the birds, while others enjoyed Nordic weaving, making clay hedgehogs and Mexican mandalas with great skill. We ended the term with songs around the fire enjoying hot chocolate and toasting marshmallows.

It has been a delight to see so many children grow in confidence, rise to challenges, and simply enjoy being outside, whatever the weather!



HEDGEHOGS CLASS



Our more recent Discover learning has been looking into Christmas - what Christmas traditions have people had in the past compared to now? What did Father Christmas wear?

Finally, Hedgehogs were absolutely fantastic in our Nativity performances! Thanks again for all your support in costume prep and listening to us practise over and over again!











Foxes Class have loved their history project this term, learning all about the story of the Gunpowder Plot.

The children have worked hard to understand the key points of the story, using their knowledge to act it out, analyse sources and create artwork inspired by the events of 1605.

BADGERS CLASS



Badgers have had a fantastic half term finding out about the Romanisation of Britain in our 'Discover: Conflict' project work. We started this term with a fascinating Roman workshop at Plumpton School where we acted as Roman soldiers and studied Roman artefacts. We finished the term with our Open Classroom, showcasing all the amazing project work and artwork that we have created. These included the incredible Roman shields and volcano sculptures inspired by our English class reader 'Escape from Pompeii'.











OWLS CLASS



Owls Class has had an exciting and thought-provoking term learning about key events in history. The children began by analysing primary and secondary sources, developing skills to understand historical documents and photos. They explored the timelines of significant events during WW1 and WW2, learning about key battles and figures. A key focus was on the experiences of evacuees during the wars, discussing how families were affected and how propaganda shaped public opinion. A particularly moving topic was the life of Anne Frank. The children learnt about her courage and the importance of remembering her story, while also exploring the issue of segregation and its impact both historically and today. The children have shown great enthusiasm and critical thinking, reflecting deeply on these important events.





What a wonderful experience Owls Class had when they visited Glyndebourne Opera House to perform in the 'One Voice' festival of singing! Over the past two terms, the children worked incredibly hard to rehearse their festive songs and learn the actions, perfecting every note and movement with great enthusiasm and dedication. The performance was a huge success; their energy and focus were truly impressive. It was a magical experience for all involved and the children made us all so proud! A big thank you to the families who came along to support the children and enjoy the performance.
