PUNCTUALITY & ATTENDANCE

In school, on time, every day, learning ready!



Punctuality

The school gate is opened at 8:30am and closed at 8:40am. Please ensure you are at school on time every day.

If you are late, you will need to take your child to the school office, where you will need to complete a **red form** to inform us of your arrival time and reason for being late. This will allow us to track punctuality across the term. Please do not leave children unattended before the gate is open, and make sure you come to the office if you are late. Arriving late not only disrupts your child's learning, but the whole school as well. Thank you for your support.

Attendance

Let's start the year as we mean to go on, and all do our very best to get the children to school every day!

Please remember that unless your child is not well enough to be in school, they need to be at school every day.

Our school attendance target is is 97%.



ATTENDANCE - YOUR SUPPORT

THE LAW

Local councils and schools can use various legal powers if your child is missing school without a good reason. They can give you:

- A Parenting Order
- An Education Supervision Order
- A School Attendance Order
- A fine (sometimes known as a 'penalty notice')



It is my duty as Head of School to address poor attendance and the duty of my Governing Body to hold me accountable for it. The majority of families at Hamsey ensure their children attend in line with expectations, and I am grateful for this. I cannot however, ignore that attendance at Hamsey, for too many children, is below that expected. Whilst we are driving up standards across the school, many are missing out on valuable learning time. This has a negative impact on the children and the wider school community.

This year I will be continuing to make attendance a top priority. Please support me and my team by bringing your child to school every day, unless they are too unwell to attend. Thank you.

READING



Whilst we will do everything we can to support your child's reading whilst they are at school, we need your support at home. *Please* read with your child little and often, at least five times per week. By writing in their reading record, we know who is reading at home and it allows us to support at school.

Reading for Pleasure:

Regularly reading to your child for the love of it provides a connection between you and your child. Families who enjoy reading together have opportunities for discussion, developing empathy and attachment. Children who read for pleasure do better in a wide range of subjects at school and it positively impacts children's wellbeing. Reading for pleasure gives the benefits of relaxation, time together, the importance of building a routine and love of reading.

UNIFORM



It has been lovely this week to see the children looking so smart! Please remember that part of our uniform policy asks that sensible school style (preferably black) shoes are worn.

A reminder:

- The only pieces of jewellery allowed are a wrist watch and plain stud earrings.
- Long hair must be tied back at all times.
- Hair accessories should be modest and suitable for an active school day.
- No make-up is permitted, including nail varnish.

Children can come to school in their PE kits on their specific class PE days.
